

## Start here!



King of the Waves from ancient Greek mythology, the Triton is our mascot. Stand next to the statue with the steps at your back—the building you're looking at is the Student Services Center, the next track on your tour. Remember to pause the audio as you move from one location to the next.

### 1 Student Services Center

Start out walking south from the Triton Statue. You'll pass by the Multipurpose Room where the campus tours start—and where you'll return if you decide to sit in on the Admissions Information Session at 1:15 p.m. This building is on your left, Town Square is on your right—and if it's a Tuesday during the academic year, you may see all the activity of the weekly Farmers' Market. At the end of the grassy square, turn to the west (your right) to walk past the 4-story pink building.



### 2 Center Hall

Did you remember to pause your audio? This is Center Hall. Go ahead all the way up the slight hill to Library Walk. When you see "the spheres" (in the picture), you can go through the walkway into a courtyard or stop for coffee. In our next track, we'll talk about the International Center, just across Library Walk.



### 3 International Center

If it's Friday around lunch time, you can join the International Café for inexpensive food and great conversations with students, staff, and faculty. For the next channel we'll ask you to look past the International Center and a little toward the southwest. On the map, you can see where you'd go, if you want... up and over the hill.



### 4 Community Centers

The Student Centers are in the John Muir College neighborhood, past the International Center, and Mandeville Center (performing arts and undergraduate visual art studios). For now, listen as we tell you about two community places here, as well as the Cross-Cultural Center—you'll see that one later, in the Price Center. In the Student Centers complex are study lounges, restaurants, and the Crafts Center. Explore more later, if you wish... but now, turn back to Library Walk and head north.



### 5 Support Services

As you go along Library Walk, you'll see the Career Services Center on your left. We have lots of information to share with you, so keep listening as you walk towards the library. Take a look through the trees to see the *Blue Fences* sculpture of the Stuart Art Collection.



### Find the Triton statue

The tour starting point is easy to find—go to the foot of the big steps, at the north end of the central square next to the Student Services Center.



### Need more details on your map?

Stop by the Visitor Information booth or the Triton Center on the first floor of the Student Services Center and ask for a full-campus map.

### 6 Geisel Library

One of the most recognizable buildings in all of San Diego, Geisel Library is a great resource. You'll walk by one of the Stuart Collection sculptures, the metal-encased tree near the entrance, and when you walk through the doors, that's another of our site-specific artworks. Check at the Information desk to find out about current exhibits in the library.



### 7 Library Walk

For this track, you'll want to turn around and head south down Library Walk. Depending on the time of day, it may be quiet and peaceful or filled with activity.



### 8 Price Center / Bookstore

For our last audio track today, you'll get an introduction to the Price Center and bookstore. Lunch, breakfast, dinner, and everything you need from studying to entertainment. We hope you enjoyed your tour! We encourage you to explore more (see box at right) and we hope to welcome you as a Triton to UC San Diego!



## Parking

Driving directions and parking information are found on the Campus Tours webpages. The Gilman Parking structure (in black on the map above) is a great choice—you must purchase your visitor's permit in the Gilman structure for it to be valid. There's a 3-hour limit (which is great for this tour) but if you want to spend more time exploring the campus, you'll be happier with alternative parking arrangements. Spending the day here? Get an all-day permit from the Visitor booth on Gilman or at North Campus. Parking on weekends is free.

- You'll always find activities of interest on the UC San Diego campus. Check out suggestions for sitting in on a class. Or attend dance, theatre, or music performances—visit the University Art Gallery—tour Geisel Library.
